The evidence is provided by his amazing career that spans over 30 years with credits on over 300 album projects representing millions in sales and numerous awards including multiple Grammys. His international reputation as the ultimate recording professional is reflected by the world-class roster of artists, musicians, producers, and business partners who continue to rely on his expertise. We are honored to call Chuck an alumnus, colleague, and most of all, a friend, and we know that when we call for his help he always responds to serve our students.

ROBERT E. MULLOY AWARD OF EXCELLENCE



Each year Belmont University's Mike Curb College of Entertainment and Music Business highlights and honors a significant entertainment industry leader who is active and dedicated to education. Continuing in this worthy tradition, audio engineer and producer extraordinaire, Chuck Ainlay, is the recipient of the 2017 Robert E. Mulloy Award of Excellence.

Chuck attended Indiana University and Belmont College and quickly became involved in the Nashville audio engineering community by serving as an assistant engineer at numerous studios. After being hired as the chief engineer at the Castle Recording Studio, Chuck met legendary record executive/producers, Jimmy Bowen and Tony Brown, which led to many collaborations and a career as an independent engineer. Chuck's discography reflects working with many of the world's top artists and musicians including George Strait, Taylor Swift, Dire Straits, Vince Gill, Miranda Lambert, Sheryl Crow, Peter Frampton, Lionel Richie, Waylon Jennings, Dolly Parton, Emmylou Harris, Trisha Yearwood, Lee Ann Womack, The Dixie Chicks, Lyle Lovett, and many, many others. He has served as engineer/producer on over 300 projects resulting in platinum selling albums and numerous awards including multiple Grammys and honors from the Academy of Country Music. Chuck's long-standing association with Mark Knopfler has resulted in two Dire Straits albums and production/engineering credits on four of Mark's solo albums, Golden Heart, Sailing to Philadelphia, Ragpicker's Dream, and Shangri La, all reaching multi-platinum status. In addition, their partnership led to producing the scores for two films, Wag the Dog and Metroland.

As a leader in cutting-edge technology, Chuck produced the first all-digital recording out of Nashville. His pioneering efforts in 5.1 surround sound are evident in such celebrated and critically acclaimed albums as High Lonesome Sound (Vince Gill), the 20th Anniversary Re-mix of Brothers in Arms (Dire Straits), and the 25th Anniversary Re-Mix of the record breaking Frampton Comes Alive (Peter Frampton).

We celebrate Chuck as a successful and awarding winning audio engineer, mixer, record producer, studio owner, innovative industry leader, and as a friend of Belmont. He is an alumnus of Leadership Music, serves on the Nashville board of the Audio Engineering Society, and is involved both locally and nationally with The Producers and Engineers Wing of the Recording Academy.

LETTER FROM THE PRODUCER

I've always said there's something unifying about live music. Not just from the audience's perspective, but from the perspective of those who put it on as well. There is an unspoken responsibility that we hold as techs, managers, and bands that keeps everyone pushing forward — as if the music we produce might have a divine purpose of bringing us all together. Music is a stronghold in which everyone is welcome, no matter their walk of life.

That is what showcase has been for me, and for so many of my friends, since I started this journey three years ago. Showcase gave me a family when I was so far away from my own. It gave me a place to fall back on when nothing seemed familiar or stable, and I know that is true for so many others. It is more than learning how to fly a lighting rig, or maintain a budget, or properly schedule a soundcheck — it is learning how to form meaningful relationships, constantly grow as a leader, and take care of those in your camp.

To Lucas Boto, my team, and my peers — those who have come before me and those who will come after me — thank you. For taking a chance, and applying the right amount of pressure to push each other further than our comfort would normally allow. It has been the utmost pleasure learning and growing with you all.

And to those reading this in the stands, thanks for choosing to be part of something bigger with us tonight.
